
Rains Eye Plan 1780s




You can see why the wealthy of this parish would soon move to the West End of Town (known often as the best end) as the population became densely over crowded and consequently many social ills were evident in the east end.






FIGURE 2 POST MILLS :

 b) HYLTON ROAD MILL






FIGURE 3 TOWER MILLS :
